The two ladies were neighbors on Mt. Vernon Street and died within months of one another. The Downs Family continues to monetarily support Kappa's Grant-In-Aid.

### Leadership Lesson

(Pg. 81) Failing to take care of those you lead can have damaging consequences. In addition to losing the loyalty, dedication, and motivation of your team, you may ultimately lose your team members. Taking some time to clear your head and analyze the situation will help you be more effective when making your points. Once you've calmed yourself, have a levelheaded discussion.
