## Kappa Chapter's October 2012 Meeting

**Treasurer Repot:** Bobbi reported that we have \$2,704.91 in the checking account. She collected dues from members for yearly dues. Bobbi said she would send out an e-mail reminder to those who have not paid. Dues need to be paid by October 31<sup>st</sup>. Dues are \$85.

**Budget**: Margaret presented the proposed 2012 -2013 budget. A motion was presented to accept the budget aw written. It was unanimously accepted by those present. \$258 was raised from the P.Buckley Moss print that was donated by Shirley.

**Program:** The schedule of Kappa Chapter meetings for 2012 - 2013 was presented and accepted by unanimous vote.

The minutes for the September meeting had been sent electronically. Paper copies of the September minutes were available. Anne asked for any changes. The minutes were accepted as written.

Membership: Membership cards were available at the meeting for pick up and applications for new members are due back to Kim Norman by the first week in November.

Legislative: Bea reported that she had coffee with Dickie Bell, hoping he would explain parts of the "Contract Bill" that would answer some of her questions and concerns. Unfortunately, Mr. Bell was not able to respond to Bea's concerns adequately. She suggested that the "temporary teacher" section of the bill be tightened up. Mr. Bell indicated that "all depends on the whim of the governor".

**Yearbook:** Betty asked that all changes to the yearbook be in to her by the beginning of November so that it will be ready by the November meeting.

**New Business:** The chapter was asked to endorse Susan Doughty for state officer. Susan has "put her hat in the ring" to be considered for an officer position at the state level. The discussion included cheers for Susan. A motion was presented to endorse her decision and was unanimously accepted.

**Program: "A New York State of Mind"** presented by Scarlett, Lynne and Anne; who all attended the International Convention in NY this summer.

Scarlett introduced the program with a power point accompanied by music. The purpose of the program was to inspire us to get involved in DKG above the chapter level.
