# President's Message

In spite of the winter weather, those of us who were able to attend the February meeting, enjoyed a delightful afternoon together. We were able to initiate Emily Glenn and Shirley Matherly into Kappa Chapter. Due to the rescheduled date, Kathy Guisewite was unable to attend, but will be initiated in an abbreviated ceremony on March 18! After lunch, our "Getting to Know Us" activity, led by Scarlett Kiser, gave us an opportunity to learn more about our members. Read the article located in this newsletter to find out more.

Our March 18<sup>th</sup> will be the last time that teams can contribute to "Push for Pennies" project in support of Schools for Africa for 2013-14. The object is to bring pennies (rolls of pennies) to put in your team's canister. Members may put other coins and paper currency into the containers of OTHER teams to offset that team's penny collection. Team A-C has collected -\$14.64; Team D-M (Dazzling Dames) has collected -\$15.32; and Team N-W has collected -\$5.24. Remember that each penny is worth one point. Each silver coin or bill reduces the number of points in that container by the amount of the coin (a nickel reduces the points by five, a dime by ten, a dollar by 100, etc...). We have collected a total of \$58.20 so far.


