

## June 13 – Mark Your Calendar Now!

People are accustomed to voting the second Tuesday in November. Many consider it their civic duty and often boast that they have never missed voting since they first registered. Some have been in a quandary on election day because they have difficulty deciding who deserves their vote and sometimes declare that they really don't like either candidate and just have to mark a ballot for the lesser of the evils.

June 13 is important because that's the date of the primary when citizens choose candidates for the November elections. Wouldn't it be wonderful if any indecision November 7 is because we have two excellent candidates who want to serve? Political parties determine their procedure for nominating candidates. They may choose a convention where only those party members who attend the convention may choose the candidate and, of course, the party bears the cost of this method. Or they may choose a primary, which is paid for by state funds.

Virginia is an open primary state, so any properly registered citizen, regardless of party affiliation, may be a part of the selection process. Even a 17-year-old who will be 18 on or before the November 7 election may vote in the primary.

Primary voting is held in the same precincts and follows the same basic procedures as the November elections. Be sure to have a picture ID, etc., just as you would in a regular election. You do not have to declare party affiliation, but you will be asked if you want a Democratic or a Republican ballot. Therefore, you can't vote for a Republican for the candidate for governor and a Democrat for the candidate for lieutenant governor. Some party members are fearful that someone from the opposing party will vote in their primary for the one they believe would be a weaker candidate in the general election, giving their candidate an advantage. What a perversion of the privilege of voting this would be! Democracy truly is in peril when it is more important to manipulate the system to get one's party elected rather than to ensure two strong candidates.

(Attorney General Mark Herring is the only declared Democratic candidate, so he will not appear on the primary ballot.)

In November all members of the House of Delegates will be up for election. Districts with more than one candidate from a party for the office of delegate will also have these candidates on their June 13 ballot.

These primary candidates are making appearances in various venues all over the state. Please attend these events, visit their websites, read about them, and be prepared to vote on **June 13** for what is just as important as the November 7 election, if not more important. We know what happens when two candidates who are not respected are the only choices in a general election.
