## Highlights from last meeting...





Juan Pablo Berrizbeitia, Executive Director of the Blue Ridge CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate), spoke during our October meeting. Established in Waynesboro in 1994, and expanding later into Lexington and Rockingham County, its vision is that every child who is the victim of abuse/neglect has a volunteer advocate. The goal is to serve 300 children annually, up from 83 children just five years ago. The idea is to assign volunteers to real cases and then the volunteer makes recommendations solely on the child's needs. Judge David Soukup was the architect of the concept. A national study indicates that kids with an advocate has 50% less chance of a second removal from the household. Getting to meet with the child once a month, the volunteer would be responsible to research and prepare a report that the judge would consider. A number of problems are associated with early trauma such as not finishing school, not being able to hold a job, and a shorter life span. That is why teachers, counselors, therapists, and friends are all vital to the child's success. Members were encouraged to volunteer, even teaming up to take on a case. The average time commitment for a case is 8-15 months. Thirty -six hours of training is required. CASA is funded by Federal Grants, state money, other grants, individual donations and fundraisers.
