Megan Townley (Food Access Manager) and Nichole Barrows (Education Manager) from Project GROWS presented at the November meeting. This 10 acre farm in Verona opened in 2010 with the mission of giving the community easy access to healthy foods and wanting kids to know where these foods come from. With childhood obesity and diabetes on the rise, Project GROWS is trying to change the diet of area students. And impacting students they are as they served 5,900 students in 2019, really getting to know the kids and building trust for them to try new things. They collaborate closely with Waynesboro and Staunton Public Schools but we have seen them first hand at Beverley Manor Middle School. The farm grows 40 different vegetables and fruits throughout the year and sells wholesale to schools. They also facilitate tastings and cooking classes at schools as well as fieldtrips out to the farm at no cost during the months of April, May, September and October. They work closely with the Boys and Girls Clubs and make donations to the food bank. And finally they hold a farmers market at several locations. In addition to just two paid full time positions and some paid part-time staff, the farm relies on volunteers. Over 500 people gave their time to this effort in 2019. Will you be part of that in 2020? The farm hosts garden work parties every Thursday from 2-7pm during the summer months. Project GROWS offers one-week summer camps (at a cost) for students ages 5-8 where kids would get to help with whatever needs to be done at that particular time of the growing season.
