# Spotlight on newer member...Laurie Niestrath



Hello, all- My name is Laurie Niestrath. I graduated from Eastern University with a BA in Elementary Education and an MEd in Adult Learning from Virginia Commonwealth University. I began my love of children and learners as a babysitter when I was 12 years old. Several years of being a mother's helper during college solidified my desire to teach and work with young learners. My certification is NK-Middle Grades. I've taught children in grades 2 through 8th grade. My middle school experience encompassed Mathematics, Language Arts and World Geography. I've taught urban, suburban and rural children. My favorite grade spans the last semester of 5th grade and the first of 6th grade. I feel fortunate to have experienced teaching before the advent of standardized testing.

My greatest joy was serving as the Lead Math Educator with an emphasis on transitioning concrete learners for abstract concepts. I've taught in a private school in South Philadelphia, in public schools in Roanoke City, Albemarle County and Greene County. Over the last two years I've worked with adults in both the GED and the Plugged-in Virginia, Skilled Trades program as an Adult Educator, through Piedmont Virginia Community College.

Over the course of my tenure, I recognized how left out and overlooked adults were in many aspects of learning. What works for children doesn't necessarily work well for adult learners. I left the traditional classroom in 2011 to better understand the difference and to learn how better to translate what I learned as an undergraduate to that of graduate school. I pursued a course of study in Adult Learning in the Human Resource Development track.

As part of this "gap" period, I indulged in several pre-retirement experiences. I trained to be a docent at The Fralin Museum of Art, UVA, become a Master Gardener and volunteered through the Piedmont MG Association and volunteered at The University of Virginia Hospital Auxiliary. As an auxilian, my last office was that of president. Active participation in the nonprofit world has been an integral part of my life. Through the Center for Nonprofit Excellence in Charlottesville, my understanding of board leadership deepened through participation in the Board Academy program. I have many educational interests. My greatest passions lie in coaching and consulting with a desire to help learners achieve educational goals.

I moved to Central Virginia from Roanoke in 1996 to join my husband who works for Northrop Grumman. My son is a Duke at James Madison University, majoring in Public Policy and Administration as well as Geographic Information Systems. We are enjoying a semi-empty nest with a yellow lab and two SPCA cats. When not trying to teach someone something, which my family contends is *not* always a welcome event, I love to read, cook, travel and knit. Quilting and genealogy are two new projects, the residual benefit of COVID-19.

## In recognition....



#### BE SURE TO VOTE - Reminders from Bea

- Early voting in Virginia started Friday, September 18. You may vote early any weekday and the last two Saturdays before November 3. Check with the registrar's office about where to vote early in person in your locality.
- There will likely not be long lines when you vote early in person, especially in the next several weeks. Curbside voting is also available.
- The deadline for applying for a mail-in ballot is October 23. Be sure to read and follow the instructions carefully.
- Mail the ballot promptly, deposit in a drop-box provided by your registrar's office. Ballots are safe there. They are removed twice a day.
- If you get the mail-in ballot but decide to vote in person, take the mail-in ballot with you and turn it in
- DO NOT MAIL IN THE MARKED BALLOT AND THEN GO TO VOTE IN PERSON!!
- Remember the importance of Constitutional Amendment 1 to allow a a commission to draw voting district lines which will allow a more transparent and fair method and avoid gerrymandering.
