Susan Schuckman, Chair Education Excellence Committee Ashley Ramey from the Library of Virginia gave us insight into the Pandemic of 1918. It was nicknamed the Spanish Flu because Spain was the first county to report a case of the influenza. Twenty to forty year-olds were most affected. It hit military bases first. Theaters, churches, schools, even the State Fair was closed down. Masks were worn but they were not very effective as they were made out of cheese cloth and gauze. It is still the worst pandemic with 675,000 American deaths and 50 million deaths worldwide.

### DEAR TEACHERS.....

Field Secretaries Ennion G.Williams & C.R. Keiley wrote to United States teacher the following letter:

" Dear teachers:

We want your earnest co-operation in efforts to prevent the a return of influenza this year, not only from a humanitarian standpoint, but to avoid closing of your school and absence on account of sickness. We know that influenza is transferred by fresh secretions of mouth and nose of person suffering from it, or those who have mild and unrecognized cases of from healthy carriers of the germ. We want every child and grown person to know this and avoid getting into the mouth secretions from the mouths of others. This can be done by teaching and practicing the two simple rule son the placard that has been sent you that you can secure by writing the State Board of Health. Please- 1. Post the placard in you school room, 2. Have pupils recite the rules daily for two weeks, and once weekly thereafter. 3. make observance of these rules part of school deportment, and have each child report daily his own observance or violation of them. Whether the schools are the safest place in the community or the most dangerous depend largely on the teacher.

# Nothing says summer like key lime and pineapple wine...

#### SUSAN DOUGHTY'S KEY LIME PIE BALLS

! pkg. cream cheese, softened

1 can sweetened condensed milk

3 ½ cups graham cracker crumbs

3 tablespoons lime juice

2 teaspoons grated lime peel

¼ teaspoon salt

¼ teaspoon cinnamon

½ cup confectioners' sugar

In a large bowl, beat the first seven ingredients until blended. Shape into 1-in. balls. Toll cookie balls in confectioner's sugar...Refrigerate 30 minutes or until firm. Store cookies between pieces of way paper in an airtight container in the refrigerator.

Easy Pineapple Wine Punch is a delicious party drink for any occasion. Just 4 ingredients go into this easy wine punch and it will instantly transport you to a tropical frame of mind!

### Ingredients

- 750 ml Moscato Wine
- 2 cups pineapple juice
- 1 cup orange juice
- 24 oz Sprite or lemon lime soda (I used Ginger ale)
- fresh pineapple for garnish \*optional

1 6 oz. can pineapple juice (1/2-3/4 cup)

1/4 cup Orange Juice

6 oz. Ginger ale
