March Meeting Highlights

Nadine James, member of Alpha Nu Chapter, zoomed in to bring us our program for the evening. Nadine and the five ladies she collaborated with to co-author <u>Memoir Your Way</u> had no idea it would be five years from the time they first met with the idea to the publication of this book. Finding a publisher was the biggest challenge. They had made a pact with each other that it would be all or nothing but, in the end, they persevered and got what they wanted as the final product.

The book outlines ideas of how you can tell your story through a variety of channels. Nadine's chapter of the book "Nurturing the Young Storyteller," focuses on her specific project of 2nd graders interviewing their grandparents with questions like "What was school like for you at my age?" and then creating a "museum" where the students served as the docents. This project truly bridged the generational gap and facilitated the use of oral history, some even going as far as creating a video to leave behind to their families.

Other chapters focused on actually taking on the challenge of writing a book. The advice was to be selective and find the true story within you. Or even going the graphic novel route, as cartooning is a unique form of self-expression. Another chapter was how to create a food memoir by basically outlining a family food story through recipes representing your family legacy or even travel memories. This could be a great wedding or graduation gift to give somebody. You could also consider a collaborative effort of say a church cookbook or even a DKG chapter collection.

Another chapter tried to put a new spin on scrapbooking to give memoiring a visual appeal, giving step by step ideas, for those people who may be better with their hands than their words. There is a chapter dedicated to quilting, with the idea that you can transform memories into cloth memories to be handed down. It can be as simple as ironing on decals to a pillow case to a more talented proposition of sewing or quilting. The author of this chapter shared a personal story of her brother passing away and how she took his t-shirts from all the places he had traveled and made them into a quilt with pockets that contained handwritten entries from his travel journal but also including these messages typed and adhered to the fabric.

Nadine has had many life experiences that enabled her to embark on this project. She has taught in Belgium, loves to travel, has walked marathons, has earned her master's degree, and has collaborated with the Smithsonian Institute and the National Park Service. She can claim to be a retired reading specialist but has actually been rehired to support literacy at Annandale Terrace Elementary School.

We thank Nadine for helping us embrace the VSO biennial theme of storytelling!
