November Meeting News from Scarlett Kiser:

We had 7 members (and four guests) for the November meeting of Kappa Chapter which was a guided tour of the manse at the Woodrow Wilson Presidential Library and access to all the exhibits. Emily Kilgore and Linda Petze were a wealth of knowledge as the two bounced stories off each other. I picked up new facts and details even though I had been there before. For example, in 1912, as President-Elect, Wilson spent two nights in his birthplace home when he returned to Staunton to celebrate his 56th birthday. Or like the fact that Edidth Wilson was instrumental in seeing that the manse was restored to the time of Wilson living there as a very young child (circa 1858) and FDR came to Staunton and dedicated the Woodrow Wilson birthplace museum in May of 1941 just months prior to the attack on Pearl Harbor. Another interesting twist was that the WWPL recently was able to recover and return an original bed to the manse and that Susan Dowdy provided a mattress that would fit the odd size bed. But I was also reminded that your birth order was also your bath order once a week and many other trivial details about life during this period. Following the tour, we scrambled in the parking lot to move our Thanksgiving dinner boxes for Wenonah Elementary into Anne Perdue's car. She delivered the 13 boxes that Kappa contributed the following week. Five of us went on to dinner at the Depot after our time together at the WWPL.
